



The EYFS Profile







Our School Day

On your child's first day of school all they need to bring is themselves looking smart in their uniform and ready to enjoy learning.

- Your child will receive a free school bag on their first day which fits in their school tray and will come home everyday with letters in, their reading diaries and work they are proud to show off. We advise that the children use this bag instead of a rucksack as the cloakrooms are small and we like to keep their bag in their tray for easy access.
- Reading diary and Reading book Your child will have their book changed 3
 times a week but please bring it in everyday so we can read and comment in
 their diary. This diary is also for you to write reading comments to us and
 any other notes. This will come home with your child in the first couple of
 weeks back to school once they're all settled.
- PE Kit Please bring a small bag with your child's PE kit in, named, for their peg to keep in school.
- Wellington boots Please bring on the first day to keep in school.

Snack and Lunch time

- Every day your child will receive free fruit or vegetable snack from school and a cup of milk. If you would like to provide your own healthy snack that is ok but we only request fruit or vegetables.
- Every child from Reception class to year 2 is entitled to a free hot school meal. In your packs you have a menu example to look over and see the delicious meals we offer, cooked fresh on site daily. There are 2 options each day including vegetarian.
- If you would prefer your child to have a packed lunch from home that is ok but we request they are healthy. Each day your child will tell the teacher if they are hot school dinner or packed lunch.
- Allergies If your child has an allergy please let the office or their teacher know and the kitchen staff can adapt meals for this. We require a letter from the doctor stating the allergy and a form will come home for you to fill in for our medical file. This is all kept confidential.

We love exploring in the outdoors and place a great emphasis on this. We have our own reception play ground for the children to learn and play all day long. Weather does not stop us so please provide wellington boots, named, with your child on their first day and they will remain in school until the end of the year.





Forest School

The children will take part in weekly forest sessions so those wellington boots will again come in handy! Mrs Farrell is also a forest school leader and plans wonderful sessions for the children to explore freely, learn about nature and help conserve our environments. We have a beautiful woodland on site, a large pond area and many outdoor classrooms.
