Have a wonderful weekend, hopefully the sun will continue to shine.



<u>Year 3</u> have had a busy start to the term finding out about Prehistoric Britain. We have been learning about the Stone Age, finding out about why people were hunter gatherers and discovering how they used natural materials to make tools and weapons. We have also been having lots of fun in science, finding out how rocks are formed and carrying out an investigation to see how hard different types of rock are. In the last few weeks we have received our violins and have begun to learn how to play them!
