# Early Years

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# UNICEF Ambassadors Update

The school raised enough money for four taps. This means that we have helped less fortunate children to get clean water. This links with Article 24 of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child. The school's UNICEF ambassadors have been learning all about Article 24.

ARTICLE 24 (health and health services)
Every child has the right to the best
possible health. Governments must
provide good quality health care, clean
water, nutritious food, and a clean
environment and education on health
and well-being so that children can stay
healthy. Richer countries must help poorer
countries achieve this.



To help the children understand the problem that some people in the world have of no clean water the children were set a challenge. They had a box full of water which was placed in one area of the school and they were given one small cup to transport the water to another box elsewhere in the school. When the other box was filled we explored what it felt like to complete the challenge. From this the children discussed how dirty the water was, how much effort it took to get

such a little amount of water and they also realised that they couldn't do much with the amount of water they had. Overall the children felt extremely lucky to have access to so much clean water.
